

## **Brooklyn College Library/Academic Information Technology (AIT) Selected Accomplishments 2019-2020 (FY20) and Goals 2020/2021 (FY21)**

Please note: most Library/AIT projects are team efforts involving managers and staff in many units and faculty and administrators across the BC schools; only the lead Library/AIT unit, is indicated in parentheses.

### **Technology and Space FY20 Accomplishments:**

- Completed working with BC Security and Project Manager from Facilities on redesign of Library entrance to deal with Security and heating/cooling issues. Incorporating use of the new ITS Digital ID to implement a swipe entrance system (AIT, COLOSU)
- Redesigned Library Website (Ref/Instruction, AIT); launch planned for July 2020:
  - Includes real time computer availability in the library
  - Faceted yet unified searching of collections through Alma/PRIMOVE
- Promoted existing Web-based research tools through social media and campus events
- Implemented a new student-centered library Food Policy that allows snacks in the library
- Worked to manage student noise issues around the library
  - In LaGuardia Reading Room, worked with Public Safety for regular sweeps;
  - Reconfigured tables and carrells on the Lower Level to reduce crowding and noise.

### **Various Library & AIT Programs FY20 Accomplishments:**

- **AIT TV Center:** The Studio B complex was added to the Library/AIT security system through the installation of a video camera system and an electronic key access key system. In addition to making the area more secure, the system satisfied the requests of TREM faculty who no longer needed to make an appointment to access the complex. In addition, it reduced the need for TVCenter staff to be present for simple faculty requests resulting in the saving of CA and overtime costs.

A room was converted in the Library Café dedicated to the needs of the School of Visual, Media and Performing Arts with specialized software and technology. The primary function of the room was to eliminate the need to open the entire Postproduction Lab to serve a few students in their out of class homework and assignments. The benefits of the room is that it expands student access to these resources and eliminates the need for off class hours CA and CLT oversight thus reducing costs.

The College has engaged DASNY to redesign the Studio B complex. AIT has been actively involved in the redesign with TREM and Facilities staff.

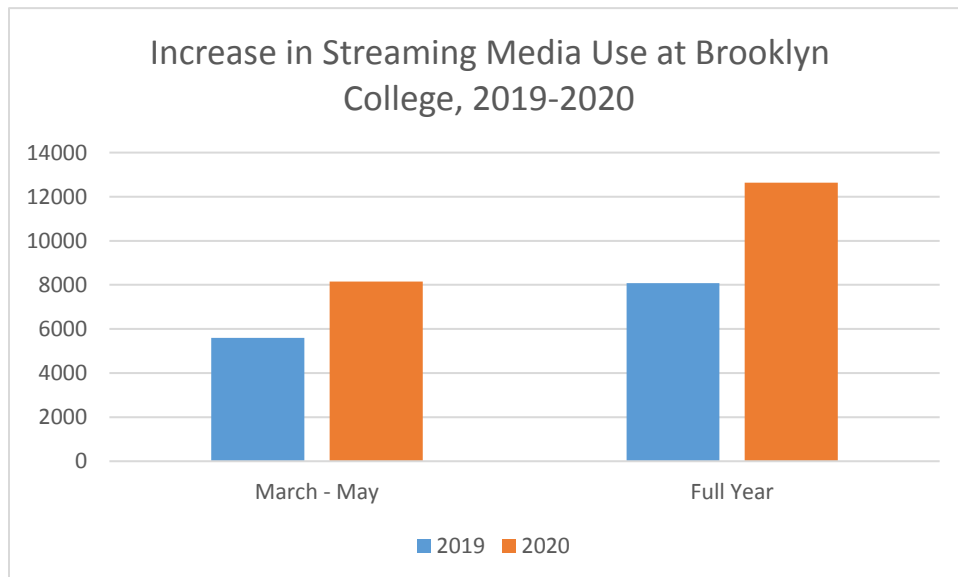
- **Open Education Resources (OER) Development:** In 2019/20 CUNY Office of Library Services approved funds for Brooklyn College 50 courses, with 125 sections for approximately 4,375 enrollees. Due to careful stewardship of the funds and excellent work by the technologists, Brooklyn College converted 71 courses, impacting 6,739 enrollees providing a savings of \$749,617. - **Scholarly Communications**

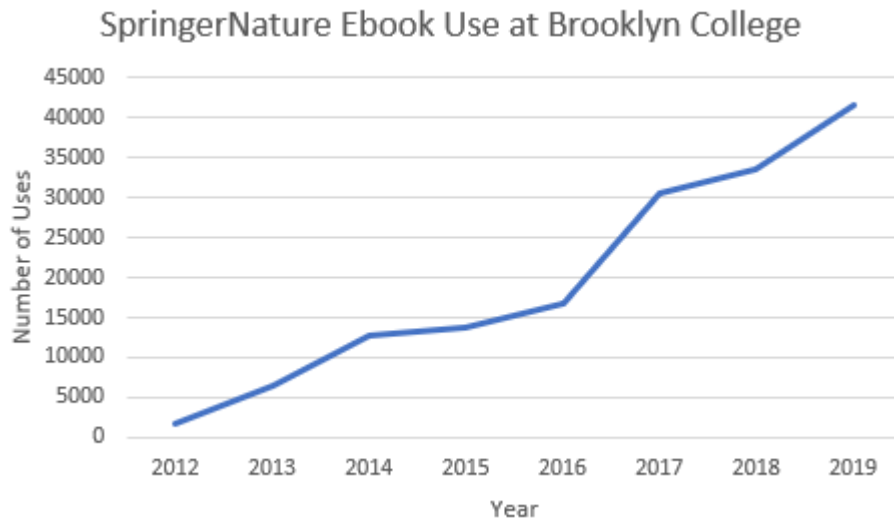
The Scholarly Communication Team continued to play an important role for faculty teaching online. In particular, issues related to copyright and intellectual property have come to the forefront. The Team continues to educate itself in this fluid environment and to share with classroom colleagues best practices as they are redefined and new resources as they are offered. Additionally, the outpouring of research into COVID-19 has impacted the process of scholarly publishing, introduced an urgency into the peer review process, and heightened general public awareness about the scholarly publishing practice and its purpose. It has also pushed discussions of the need to increase open and speedy access to research. Brooklyn College librarians will continue to educate faculty and others about these new trends and their implications.

### Collection Management FY20

- Supported OER and Zero-Textbook Cost courses at Brooklyn College by providing access to over 1000 library-funded linked resources on course pages from over 30 licensed databases and electronic collections. (Collection Management)
- Provided access to streaming media in support of online teaching and learning through previously-purchased collections, such as Docuseek2, a la carte fulfillment of streaming video needs through platforms such as Kanopy, and through new platforms, e.g., Swank Digital Campus, in response to the needs of departments like Film, which are heavily reliant on streaming media in the online teaching environment. (Collection Management)
- The need for streaming video was proven again this year, which saw an increase in the use of library-funded streaming media at Brooklyn College by more than 42% over the previous year; comparing the use during the Covid-19 period of online teaching (March through May) with the same period in the previous year, we saw an increase in use of library-funded streaming media of over 162%. (Collection Management)



- Utilized New York State Cooperative Collection Development funds to diversify local holdings in Literature and American History. (Collection Management)
- Working closely with the CUNY Haitian Studies Institute, selected and ordered \$11,000 in books to support HSI. (Collection Management)
- Added approximately 6000 print books (HIS books not included in total), and 146,000 ebooks through both local purchase and CUNY subscriptions; increased our serials holdings by 33,000 volumes. (Collection Management)
- Acquired the 2019 SpringerNature ebook Package, including monographs in STEM, Psychology, Education, Business and Economics, and Humanities. SpringerNature ebooks are very frequently used by the Brooklyn College community, with use increasing significantly every year. (Collection Management)



## Reference & Instruction

### Reference

- Successful shift to remote learning/remote work - through enhanced online Reference with increased coverage of Ask a Librarian chat reference service (BC strategic Plan Goal 4 E e)
- Instruction through required Library program for first year students (English 1010 and 1012) and the delivery of more specialized upper-level course-integrated instruction by subject librarians to their departments and programs; moved entirely online in March 2020, delivering both synchronous and asynchronous research instruction
- Liaison Program - Outreach to Faculty regarding materials purchases for support of online learning, scholarly communication, course-integrated instruction, subject-specific online research guides, etc.

- Outreach
  - Supervised a Communications undergraduate intern - updated social media policy and plans (BC Strategic Plan Goal 2 B), provided feedback on new website, aided other bibliographers in updating their libguides
  - Promoted physical and online Library resources at Orientations and various First College Year events, including promotion through First College Year Library Bulletin, Graduate Student Library Bulletin, and Transfer Student Library Bulletin
  - Additional outreach: continued collaboration with the Learning Center to have a writing tutor stationed in the library three days a week during the fall and spring semesters; Continued support of the Mellon Transfer Student Research group, the Honors Academy, The Nation (formerly TransferNation), undergraduate admissions (open house tours of the library for prospective students and their families, training the admissions Navigators re library facts), created Library exhibit in conjunction with Hess Scholar in Residence; developed an online Academic Integrity Tutorial for Undergraduate Students
  - Enhanced student support programs, including those for special populations, such as transfer students (cf. Transfer LOOP and orientations), SEEK (SEEK hasn't had its "own" librarian in well over a decade; now they do)(summer library orientation, provide research help for summer projects), students with disabilities, veterans, and international students.
  - Continue to provide instructional (average of 8 classroom sessions each semester) and resource support to BC's three Early College High School collaborators: STAR at Erasmus, Brooklyn College Academy, and College Now.
  - ISSO - Albarillo has been integrally involved in the development and deployment of the ISSO, including weekly 2-4 released hours to work in the office; co-authored a successful \$150,000 for Robin Hood Student Emergency COVID 19 Response Grant
  - Asian American Studies Program - participation in steering committee (Albarillo)
  - UndocuALLY participation in steering committee (Albarillo)
  - Indigenous Studies Working Group; also created a libguide for it and for Hess Scholar in Residence libguide/page for Winona LaDuke <https://libguides.brooklyn.cuny.edu/indigenoustudies> (Georgas)
  - Library exhibits for the Hess Scholar in Residence Program (2019, Jose David Saldivar and 2020, Winona LaDuke) (Georgas)
  - Participation in the Faculty Reading Group (Georgas), for which this year's reads were both Indigenous Studies related
- Bloomberg Terminals Training and Usage Statistics (Ref&Instr) - the nimble response is that FA looked into remote usage for the KSB, they chose not to pursue. Also, he pointed them to Mergent and stats are up (from MPH)
